Our desire is that we would be able to go to Korea in April, finalize plans for ministry, and then come back to the US in May to see Alyssa properly graduated from high school, and move the rest of us back to Korea in June.

We have had a busy but exciting summer! God gave us encouraging meetings in South Dakota and Montana. The Lord allowed Dan to lead a young man to Christ, and many committed to work diligently in the harvest field of souls.

The Lord has encouraged us in our ministry through John 4, where Jesus admonishes the disciples to "look unto the fields, for they are white already unto harvest." We just completed the Baptist World Mission 50th annual conference with the theme—Now is the Time. We have

been burdened lately that now is the time—the field of souls is ready to be harvested. Korean souls are ready to hear about a Savior who loves them and wants them to come to Him. We were looking back through our survey trip pictures, and one was of a group of junior high school children on a field trip, learning about Buddha. Those children would be high school age by now, with the pressures of academics and trying to meet their parents' expectations.



One of the statistics we researched is that the second highest rate of suicide is among high school aged children. I couldn't help but wonder what had happened to those precious young people. Is it too late to reach some of those we met up there on the mountain?

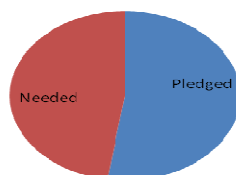
We ask you to covenant with us to earnestly pray that God will
